Teaching legal writing is teaching professional identity and membership in a discourse community.



Radical Idea #1: Communication, not law, is the core curriculum of the legal writing teacher and the practice of the lawyer.



Radical Idea #2: The survival of the rule of law turns on how effectively we enable students transition their professional identity.



Teaching legal writing is rhetorical, through and through.



Radical idea #3: The substance of what we in legal writing teach is rhetoric—how to influence (and interpret) the thoughts and actions of others in a legal discourse community.
